Dorset and Somerset Air Ambulance

There was an informative and interesting talk given by Mr Crew, a volunteer from the Dorset and Somerset Air Ambulance (DSAA) team on 13 April. The DSAA is a registered charity that was launched in Somerset in 2000, thirteen years after the first air ambulance charity was launched in Cornwall in 1987. There are currently 21 Air Ambulance charities serving the UK with a combined fleet of 36 helicopters. They receive no direct funding from the Government or National Lottery and are solely funded by donations. Their operational costs are over £5 million annually with the approximate cost of each mission being around £3.000.

Since 2017 the DSAA has been flying an Agusta Westland helicopter (AW169). It is equipped with 360-degree patient-access and a full suite of sophisticated clinical equipment. The Pegasus helicopter, affectionately known by the crews as "Peggy" carries one pilot, one co-pilot, a Critical Care Doctor (surgeon level) and a paramedic to every call-out.

The DSAA can reach anywhere in Dorset or Somerset within 20 minutes and then takes patients to the most suitable hospital. Yeovil District Hospital does not have a landing pad so cannot be used.

You may have seen recent advertising for 'What Three Words', where the whole country is divided into 3m squares each identified by three different words. For example, the entrance of the Village Hall's three words are "overture.tablet.crispier". By downloading the What Three Words App to your phone, the emergency services are able to pinpoint your exact location. The DSAA works in conjunction with all other emergency services including the Coastguard, Ambulance Service, Police and Fire and Rescue.

The DSAA's busiest day is Sunday and the busiest month is, rather surprisingly, September. A breakdown of the types of incidents they attend shows that 23% are medical, 52% are trauma, 23% are cardiac (and therefore time-critical) and 2% are transfers.

The DSAA relies heavily on public donations and there are many ways to help: the weekly lottery, "Flight for Life", which takes place every Friday with no rollovers and a jackpot prize of £1,000 for a £1 ticket and the two Grand Raffle draws in summer and at Christmas. Other ways they can raise much-needed funds are via one-off personal donations or regular donation through direct debit, fund raising events, gifts from Wills, etc. Please visit their website for details: https://www.dsairambulance.org.uk



Weeds!

An interesting talk about 'Good Weeds/Bad Weeds' was given by Stephen Fry from the

Brimsmore Gardens Group on Monday 16 June. We learned about

several varieties of vigorous weeds and the difficulties of getting rid of them. Some weeds can be useful, such as Sweet Woodruff (see photo) which can be used as a flavouring in food and drink. Some weeds can be harmful, such as Japanese Knotweed, which can grow at an alarming rate and cause a lot of damage in its' path. Non-native



plants have the potential to change ecosystems and habitats, outcompete native plants, lay dormant for long periods of time and be expensive to eradicate.

Top Tip! - Don't be tempted to sneak home with a plant or cutting when you go abroad! Importing plants is already subject to some restrictions and the RHS and Defra says it can introduce new pests and diseases into the UK.
