

## Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> September 2022 Fifteenth Sunday after Trinity – Proper 21

#### 'According to the Scriptures'

The media coverage of the funeral of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II has been remarkable in both its extent and content. While some may have become a little bored with the range and number of people giving an opinion about the many and varied content, from military precision and pomp to fashion statement and critique, one thing is certain. We have never had so much exposure to and comment upon the Christian faith in the media.

This is, in large part, down to the faith and witness of Her Late Majesty. In recent decades as her own faith has deepened, she became more open in sharing her belief in Jesus as our Saviour and the impact that belief has had on her life and actions. Echoing the George Herbert poem and hymn "Seven whole days not one in seven" increasingly reminding us that the Lord's teaching and calling is for all aspects of our lives, and certainly not only for attendance in church on a Sunday.

I understand that Her Majesty's deepening of faith came from a lifetime of prayer and engagement with the scriptures, each and every day, and that at different parts of her life — as in the preparation for her coronation — she would have a more involved engagement with the support of others. We can and do claim that our lives are full of business and responsibility, and they are, but so was that of the late Queen, while our tasks may be somewhat more mundane, hers were no less onerous. It all comes down to what our priorities are.

If we want to make sure we have and gain all that we desire or think we deserve, then we will be distracted by all the disappointments we encounter on the way and invest time and energy in revising our plans to get these things. If we put God at the centre of all that we do, starting the

day at His feet reading the scriptures, saying our prayers and listening for Him to speak to us through them, we will find that the need for other things fades and we are left with the true treasure, which is a closer walk with God in Christ Jesus.

Our standard prayer books are good for this, made up as they are of texts drawn from all over the scriptures – even the first words at morning prayer "O Lord open our lips" are taken from a psalm – but what are we to do if we do not understand. As the Eunuch said to Phillip 'how can I know if I have no-one to teach me?', and we can do this in one of two ways. We can find ourselves a book, one of the many one volume editions of scriptural commentary or we can meet with a group of like-minded souls and talk about them together. This is what we have been doing in the Wednesday afternoon Bible Study sessions on zoom. I meet with a small group of people and we talk about the scriptures for the following Sunday, not in a lecture or academic way, but trying to answer the question, "what does this reading mean for me, in my life?". ### **Invitation to join a Local Learning Group**

My name is Chris Varley and I regularly attend St Martin's in West Coker.

In answer to our Benefice Prayer I have recently been called to become a Licenced Lay Minister, otherwise called a Reader. This is a two-year training program sponsored by the Diocese of Bath & Wells in association with Sarum Theological College and the University of Durham. When licenced, I will be qualified to conduct some services like Matins and funerals, but not to lead the administration of the sacraments.

As part of my training, I have to form a Local Learning Group of about seven people to hear what I have been learning and to provide feedback. It would be beneficial, if each of the Benefice Churches would be willing to appoint one volunteer to participate in this Local Learning Group.
